


#### Fan Donated to Shanti Sthal (Jalipool Crematorium Ground) – 29th August 2025

This project stands as a symbol of sustainable sanitation and environmental stewardship. The facility was inaugurated by Brig Jha, Mr. Tashi Wangyal, IGP, Law and Order, and Club President Rtn. Naresh Agarwal, in the presence of Rotarians, Army officials, dignitaries, and local community representatives. The bio-toilet will directly benefit soldiers, pilgrims, and tourists visiting the revered Baba Mandir, ensuring hygiene in the fragile Himalayan ecosystem. The project, executed with relentless efforts by Rtn. Aswin Oberoi, Rtn. Gurpreet S. Dhunna, and supported by Rtn. Dr. Arijit Banerjee, was formally handed over to the Indian Army for maintenance and use. 
